



Joining Instructions Tallulah



By Road: ALLOW PLENTY OF TIME ON SUMMER WEEKENDS AND HALF TERM WEEKS

All joining times are 1500hrs unless advised differently.

Joining in St Mawes

1 Via Plymouth and the A38. Take the A390 at Dobwalls just past Liskeard. Three miles beyond St Austell take a left turn sign posted St Mawes. Follow the signs towards St Mawes but take care - narrow Cornish road with very solid hedges. Follow signs for King Harry Ferry. Then paragraph 3.

2 Via Okehampton and the A30. Dual Carriageway until Carlands Cross. Then follow A3076 for Truro and Falmouth. Just beyond Truro at Playing Place turn left following signs for St Mawes via King Harry Car Ferry.

3 On the East side of the Fal on what is called the Roseland half a mile up the hill from King Harry Ferry is a junction signed to Tolverne. Drive to the end of the this road and park outside the gates. A Tallulah crew member will be waiting for you inside the gate on the pontoon.

5 By Public Transport:

A scenic way to arrive is by train to Falmouth. The main line train services goes to Truro and via a branch line to Falmouth.

Then get your sea legs aboard the passenger ferry from The Prince of Wales Pier in the centre of Falmouth to St Mawes (operates every half hour during the day in almost any weather!) Let us know you arriving by Ferry from Falmouth, the time you arrive and we will come and collect you. If coming by ferry to St Mawes we will meet you on St Mawes Quay at the joining time.

If St Mawes ferry is not running, there are buses from Truro bus station to St Mawes. Local taxis service is Graham on 01326 279042

Joining Instructions for Alternative Ports

Sometimes due to strong winds you may have to join in different places.

Please check your joining port the day before you join or follow messages on your mobile phone on the day of joining.

Smugglers Cottage, Tolverne TR2 5NG

The Tallulah voyage may start at Smugglers Moorings pontoon on the sheltered River Fal, as it may be too bouncy in St Mawes.

You can park for free on a private road. If we finish the voyage in St Mawes, we can give lifts back to your car. It's only a 10-minute drive.

If you are in St Mawes, go back along the A3078 to the village of St Just. Take a left turn onto the B3289 towards King Harry Ferry.


Just after Penberth Farm, there's a 90-degree left bend where the road drops down a wooded hillside. Halfway down, there's a private road to the right to Smugglers Cottage at Tolverne. The sign says "tearooms permanently closed." It's a muddy, leafy road but all concrete, built for D-Day landing tanks.

The road ends after about a mile at a gate. You can see the pontoons on the river from the end of the road. Park on the right side of the road. The gate is open to pedestrians. We will meet you with our blue wooden dinghy (No 8) on the pontoon at 1500 hrs.
